2. Reading and Approval of the Minutes

3. Reports from senate officers and senate committees

A. Thomas King: Report on regular SEC meeting with VPAA Carol Ash

That regular meeting did not take place because Dr. Ash was not available. The SEC did meet, though, and set the agenda for the April meeting.

D. LePetria Rhoe: Faculty Welfare Committee Report

LePetria reminded the senate of the committee's charge, to advocate for faculty matters

that impact our work environment. She has confirmed the committee's membership, and the group had a meeting recently, where they decided to meet quarterly henceforth. LePetria asked senators to ask the faculty to write to email her with concerns, issues, and ideas.

There ensued a short discussion about the faculty lounge at Union Avenue, which isn't currently in suitable shape for use. It was agreed that the faculty welfare committee would look into this. There was also a discussion, that the committee would continue, about how the college might better recognize retiring full-time faculty.
